As mentioned before pragmatic management practices for our HSE & other compliance obligations remain despite the doors being closed along with the addition of the evolving required COVID prevention measures and equipment for all committee members, staff, contractors and users alike.

But it is unlikely that a Fayre day (in its usual guise) will be possible, which is a main part of our fundraising income, so the year will continue to be a challenge.

Parish Council Keeping You Informed

Well a long cold winter is behind us now and we can look forward to better weather, hopefully with Covid restrictions being progressively reduced.

Ancholme Way via Carr Lane Nothing more to report on the link to the river at this time, other than tenders etc are in progress for the work to make the river bank more navigable. Gates are planned to restrict access to use of walkers and bicycles. There continues to be issues regarding off road motor bikes throughout the Parish along Public Rights of Way, which is a concern for everyone who uses these walks. It is an offence that should be reported to Humberside Police via the 101 telephone system. Our Community Police can access video links from Facebook Messenger, vehicle registration numbers are important. The British Transport Police have also been been involved with such incidents at the crossing near Thornholme Priory which is no longer a PROW in any case. A polite mention here regarding where we can walk off the extended Carr Lane. Generally speaking the tracks running North/South from the first drain and beyond is not permissible that being farm land.

Cuckooing There is an interesting Safer Neighbourhoods article included in the Newsletter regarding "Cuckooing". Appleby is generally speaking very low on crime compared to other areas, but there have been incidents similar to those described in the article in the past.

Playground Equipment There have been some concerns raised relating to one of the pieces of playground equipment which resulted in it being taped of until the NLC Park Inspectors had chance to visit and confirm that it was safe to use with a rider that extra care should be taken in wet conditions with signs posted to that effect. That particular piece of equipment has been in place for many years and was built by a local resident/cabinet maker/carpenter. However Parish Council are looking to replace the equipment just the same. We will be applying for a grant as we certainly couldn't afford to replace it from our own reserves and so will take some time to turn around.

While on the subject of the playground area, the outdoor gym equipment remains taped off as per Covid restrictions which is the case at the time of this Newsletter going to print. Covid advice posters have long been in place regarding responsibilities in the playground.

Santon update. Off road motorcycles continue to be an issue on the PROW at High Santon and plans are afoot to have that walk properly gated with the land owners permission. A Parish traffic meeting took place on Friday 6th March. Unfortunately a British Steel representative was unable to attend. We've had some differing information regarding traffic monitoring and Parish Council will ask British Steel if a Community Speed Watch team could operate on that stretch of road. We'll get some further information to Santon residents soonest.

Potholes on the road between the Toll Cottages and Woodside Concrete have been filled by NLC, even though at this stage there are still ongoing discussions as to the ownership of that stretch of road. The same discussions take in ownership of the verges on the North side of Santon Lane at High Santon Villas. Francesca Marrit has obtained some litter picking equipment from NLC and some longstanding fly tipping debris has been collected for removal. Should anyone wish to help out in that respect for further litter picking Francesca's e-mail address is franmarritt@icloud.com

Best Kept Village and Planters. As we move towards the summer the planters around the Parish will be restocked and we'll make an entry again to the Best Kept Village competition organised by the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England. It would be great if residents could continue to water the planters near their homes during the summer. On top of this we've had a suggestion regarding sponsorship of Planters and so if anyone would like to actually sponsor a planter for the plants and take care of the watering/maintenance during the summer please let our Parish Clerk Kerry know, her email is at the foot of this report. Parish Council will also be giving a prize again for the best hedge in the village and we could extend that to the best sponsored planter. The judging will take place in the last couple of weeks of July so there's plenty of time to prepare gardens and flower/plant arrangements outside your homes. The differences between competing villages amounts to only a couple of points a year so we're always in with a shout. We're happy to make an entry for High Santon, Clapp Gate and the Station Area as well should residents there wish to get involved. It may need some co-ordinating regarding displays. Cuckooing

What is Cuckooing?

Criminal Law Definition:

Cuckooing is a form of crime in which drug dealers take over the home of a vulnerable person in order to use it as a base for drug dealing.

Cuckooing behaviour can be carried out by :

- · Organised Crime Groups OCG's.
- · Street Workers
- · Family/Friends/Associates

How do you know someone is being cuckooed?

- · Increase in visitors or calls to a property
- · New people at a property or location
- · Regularly changing residents at a property
- Changes in the mood of a resident at a property secretive / withdrawn / aggressive / paranoid / emotional
- · Evidence of substance use/paraphernalia (unless this is normal behaviour)
- · Changes in a persons appearance / clothing style
- Unexplained and unaffordable items appearing
- · Residents or people you know going missing for protracted periods of time
- · Young / Vulnerable persons seen in different vehicles / taxis
- · Persons in your community appearing unfamiliar with the surroundings
- Truancy / Exclusion / Disengaging from services such as schooling, local clubs, social care workers
- · Increased Anti-Social Behaviour in the area
- · Unexplained injuries or accounts of how injury resulted not seeming plausible

Who is at risk of cuckooing?

- · Drug users
- Older persons
- · Those suffering with mental health illness or physical health problems
- · Sex Workers
- · Single parents
- · Substance addicts (alcohol / drugs)
- · Those living in poverty or with limited finances

If something doesn't feel right REPORT IT !!

- Telephone the Police on 101 (or 999 in an emergency)
- Call Crimestoppers (anonymous) 0800 555 111
- · Contact the Social Housing provider

Professionals (Social Services Ongo NHS etc) can submit the intelligence via a PIF (Partnership Information Form) to the police stating:

- * What did you see/ do you know
- ★ When did you witness it/be told the information
- ★ Who does it involved (include descriptions of individuals/vehicles)
- ★ Where did this take place

2021 Census

On 21 March a census will takes place which by law you must complete. Its purpose is to give the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales.

The census which takes place every 10 years asks questions about you, your household and your home. In doing so, it helps to build a detailed snapshot of our society. Information from the census helps the government and local authorities to plan and fund local services, such as education, doctors' surgeries and roads.

We are ready to re-launch after the lockdown release on 21st June. Our plans were to have this year's Fayre day on the 20th June so we have cancelled this date instead we are proposing to hold .it on **4th July 2020** as Appleby Independence Day

Residents will you be ready for a relaunch but on a smaller scale. We have secured the National Mountain Biking Team formally Animal Bike Tours Now Savage Mobile Bike Tours who can perform on the basketball court 5 shows on the hour from 12.00





We have the Dog Agility Team willing to perform Dog Flyball 1.30, 2.30 and 3.30pm

The thinking is to just keep car parking to the playing field. This arrangement would mean reducing the arena to about one third of normal size for the dog's and a steam traction engine pad for the Santon steam roller and other static steam engines.

We want to encourage new and existing residents to attend so craft stalls will be 16ft apart from each other and will be under whatever COVID-19 procedures are in place at the time.

A hog roast is planned with a bar in the open. For those stalls needing cover we normally would house them in the village hall, instead we will have an outside tented areas limited to maybe just one tent for up to ten stallholders. This might be open sided to ensure social distancing is maintained

We intend to open the Village Hall as a Tea Room with some outside tables in the Car Park area to welcome you here for a break from activities for scone teas and cakes and a sandwich.

We are working on a field entry figure to be minimum of $\mathfrak{L}2$ Adult and $\mathfrak{L}1$ Children for over 5 (under 5s free). The play area will be open but no fun fare style area this time. Plenty of activities




Sheila Hesseltine has moved out of the village and taken residence at Baytree Court Residential Home on Normanby Road, and has asked to pass on her thanks to all those

which was eventually shortened to its current domain of appleby-lincs.co.uk

The concept of the website in Anita's mind's eye was her desire for Appleby to have a presence on the web and, or as she says in her own words "to share the pride I had in our lovely village".

Anita goes on to say, "Having spent much of my childhood in the village and then buying a cottage here in 1983, just as mains drains were being installed!, I had good insight into the origins and development of the village and I wanted to share some of the rich history and tradition that helped make our village what it is today.

As I delved deeper I discovered a wealth of fascinating information such as the history behind the Church Wall, how the estate houses were designed and how the village looked centuries ago. Several residents shared their knowledge and photos with me and this just added to the many layers of history and memories featured on the website.

When the Appleby Open Gardens was cancelled in 2003 we held a virtual event complete with photos, poems and stories. This created world wide interest and even resulted in a party of Americans visiting the village - they stayed overnight in The Thatched Cottage and we count them as among our friends to this day!

However there comes a time when the virtual baton needs to change hands so I'm pleased to announce Craig Johnsen has agreed to take over that baton

On taking over the website on 1 March Craig said, "After many dutiful years Anita Cross has made the difficult decision to no longer maintain the Appleby-Lincs website. This site has been of great service to the village and a useful social tool for the many events that occur in the village and platform for the facilities of the parish. As such I didn't want to lose the tool and a I've agreed to take on the administration of the site until we decide a long term future. So thank you Anita for creating and maintaining for so long, and to all residents if there is anything you want to see on the site or if you have any ideas for developments do let me
