Local District Elections

4 May 2023

As reported in the previous editions the boundaries for local election though not for general elections have been redrawn resulting in Broughton and Appleby ward being split.

Appleby Parish for local elections has been transferred into the Burton upon Stather and Winterton ward. Broughton parish moved into a new ward of Broughton and Scawby.

Vacancies for three parish councillors

Local government council elections took place on the 4th May in 230 of the 317 District, Unitary and Metropolitan authorities across England. On the same date around 6480 parish councils were up for election. Many parishes were uncontested elections as the number of candidates were the same as or fewer than the number of places available for election.

In the case of Appleby Parish there were vacancies for eight councillors and, as only four candidates put themselves forward they were therefore elected without voting as an uncontested election. Since the election a fifth person has stepped forward and has been co-opted onto the parish council. As things now stand there are vacancies for three councillors to be filled.

We are now looking for three residents to fill these vacancies

So what is a Parish Council?

A parish council is a local authority that makes decisions on behalf of the people in the parish and has an overall responsibility for the well-being of its local community. Often it is to the parish councillors who residents go to first with concerns or ideas. For this reason parish councillors are a vital part of any community.

The work of a parish council falls into three main categories:

- · representing the local community
- · delivering services to meet local needs
- · striving to improve quality of life in the parish

One of the roles of a parish council is to set a tax precept for the parish to cover the cost it expects to incur during each financial year. For Appleby Parish the 2023/24 precept is around £11,500. How this money is used is the function of the Parish Council to manage. Would you like to have some say in how it is spent within Appleby, Santon, Clapp Gate?

Becoming a parish councillor is a rewarding experience and often described by those that get involved as a way of giving something back to their community. The council meet for approximately two hours once a month depending on what needs to be discussed. Council meetings are open to the public.

If you would like to play a role in Appleby parish community please apply to become a parish councillor. There are some basic requirements as follows:

Qualifications to be a Councillor

You must:

- · be least 18 years old
- be a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any member state of the European Union, and
- meet at least one of the following four qualifications:
- a) Your name must appear on the register of local government electors for the parish/community at the time of your application and throughout your term of office.
- b) You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish during the whole of the 12 months before the day of your application
- c) Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of your application has been in the parish.. You do not have to have paid employment to qualify, as long as your main or only place of work is in the parish/community area.
- d) You have lived in the parish/community area or within three miles of it during 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election.

As a taster why not drop in to a meeting to get an idea of the type of issues that can be addressed. Future dates of meetings are listed in Dates for your Diary or can be found on the PC website at www.applebyps.org.uk.

On a final note there will be no Gardens and Scarecrows event this year.




were a wonderful spectacle of community collaboration and good will. Many parishioners gave their time and creative talents

Appleby Litter Pickers!

The Appleby Litter Pickers have been busier than ever during late spring and early summer. Anthia is litter picking when time permits while Michael is keeping the area around the Station up to Appleby looking pristine. Santon residents Leigh and Ronnie tackled both Santon and Dawes Lanes a few weeks ago, giving it a really good clean resulting in over 44 bags of litter, numerous oil cans, tyres, drums and clothes as well as reporting fly tips to North Lincs Council. A big thank you to all concerned.

lan and I have been busy around the area and further afield too. We keep a log of our activities which now contains some interesting stats. We have picked approximately 60 miles of verges. Our bags filled tally is closing in on 1000 and by the time the newsletter is published will no doubt exceed that. The weight of a full bag of litter can be anything from 5kg to 9kg. It is astonishing to think we have removed well in excess of 10 tons if we include the fly tipped rubbish, drug paraphernalia, tyres, car parts as well as the general litter from our area!

Litter picking is a simple, yet rewarding way to make a positive impact on our region. I personally enjoy the act of cleaning up and find it deeply satisfying to see a space transformed from eyesore to beauty spot. A litter free area is also far less likely to attract excessive fresh litter. Of course there will always be odd bits of newly tossed litter appearing, but now the verges have been cleared of years of accumulated litter, it takes minutes to pick up. A recent walk up Risby Road for example resulted in just 2 bags of rubbish compared to around 60 bags earlier this year!

It has been interesting to note when we have been ice-creaming how many people, both local and from further afield, have commented how tidy and litter free this area is. This is due in no small part to the selfless activities of local volunteer group members from Broughton Wombles, Barton Baggers, Scunthorpe Litter Pickers, Appleby Litter Pickers and numerous individual picker-uppers. They are all making a difference!

If you fancy joining the growing community of volunteer litter pickers all around the country then please get in touch with North Lincs Council. They are really supportive of local volunteers. Talk to them to find out how you can get hold of equipment and pink bags. They can offer advice on where to leave the full bags plus offer advice on safety and support on litter picking in general. Then go out when you feel like it or when you see a littered area and make a difference. You are welcome to join me when I'm out and about too. Just get in touch to see where I am going next. Lastly, if you wish to show your support when you see a volunteer litter picker in action please give them a toot on your horn and a cheery wave (and a wide berth) - a spot of encouragement goes a very long way!
