Readers may recall in Spring 2023 we reported as a consequence of the Russian invasion on 24th February 2022 the Buchynska family of Mum Iryna and her two daughters, Maria and Melania arrived from Ukraine to be hosted at family home in Appleby where they still live.

Iryna and her two girls continue to be hosted in the village. Iryna found employment in the village and now wishes to put her Ukraine photographic training in to some useful purpose, in her own words she explains why this is: -

I am once again pleased and very grateful to address you, dear readers. I'd like to share a bit about myself professionally and what defines me. I work as a photographer and videographer. In my previous role, I was employed at Suspilne Television, where I worked as a news operator for television. Let me start from the beginning.

Fourteen years ago, with the arrival of my daughter, I embraced motherhood and purchased a professional camera, attending photography courses to delve into this fascinating profession.



# **Egdon Resources Community Fund**

# Appleby Parish Is Excluded


Along with two other partners Egdon Resources operate the Wressle 1 oil & gas field. As part of their policy of 'being a good neighbour' in late 2022 they set up a Community Fund. The fund derives it's income from the proceeds of production and is operated at arm's length.

Egdon teaming up with the Broughton Community and Sports Association (BCSA) appointed BCSA to run the fund on their behalf. In the three windows open for grants between September 22 to August 23 the Egdon Community Fund granted £82.5k to 26 successful applicants

The fund is not open to Appleby Parish as the fund rules stipulate grants are for organisations based in the parish of Broughton.


Appleby Parish Council take a view that Appleby parish should have access to the funds for a number of reasons two of which are as follows:

- Wressle 1 site is located just inside the northern boundary of Broughton parish. but all access on the road and track running from B1208 to the site and down to the river are in the Appleby Parish.
- PELD 182 is mainly under in Appleby parish. Egdon Resources along with
  it's two partners have exploration and production rights approved by
  government under licenses know as PEDL (Petroleum Exploration and
  Development Licence) in the case of Wressle 1 & 2 the blocks are PEDL 180
  and PELD 182 as shown in the map below.



As reported in the last issue Egdon with their partners are applying to open a second well to be known as Wressle 2.

The economic production of both wells is expected to last until 2039



# **Appleby Litter Pickers**

Some litter picking updates. Mid February and it was a lovely afternoon for a walk combined with a Risby Road litter pick. We filled 4 bags to the brim from the end of the hedges as far as Low Risby



(fantastic having the HandiCart on picks like this) plus, we gathered up a top-box-lid thingy, a nitrous oxide canister and a load of roofing felt. It's probably 12 weeks since our last pick along here so I expected it to be pretty well littered. This is just a 900 yard section of rural lane used these days as a shortcut/racetrack for traffic from further afield and it seems to attract more than it's fair share of cans, bottles and fast food litter - it doesn't take long though to whizz up there and perform a tidy up. It's very different to those first picks when we were removing tons of historic litter and all manner of mini fly tips, tyres etc.



At the end of February and into the start of March we tackled the verges skirting Appleby woods. We are so lucky to have Michael Allen litter picking Appleby village to the station area and beyond and so we picked up where he'd left off getting as far as the Brigg junction. Another great team of volunteers, Broughton Blooming Wombles, keep the verges clean where it is safe to do so from that point, down to Broughton and Brigg. These areas were always heaving with litter and looked so unsightly but nowadays it is as it should be, a beautiful countryside lane.

If anyone wondered what the mini fly tip was on the verge further up Risby Road towards High Risby

earlier in the month then you might be surprised to hear that when I went up there to clean up I found it was tubs of assorted sweets! Mind you I'm pretty sure they WERE sweets, probably portioned up for a party, but apparently it's not unknown for drugs to be disguised as sweets! We do sometimes pick up drugs, needles and related paraphernalia. These are always left safe/in situ and reported to North Lincs Council for collection.

We have reported more than a dozen fly tips over the last few weeks. Some had evidence of ownership and we have heard that North Lincs Council will be investigating and pursuing enforcement action against these people where possible. As always we are very grateful for their support in providing bags and collecting them afterwards, their team always show their appreciation too when they see us. It is sickening to see that the lane down to Risby Warren is being used as a regular dumping ground. There is chemical spill too, which has been reported to the Environment Agency to take action. The warren is a Site Of Special Scientific Interest, as SSSI. This is a formal conservation designation by Natural England and usually it describes an area which is of particular interest to science due to the rare species of flora and fauna it contains. In other words, these areas have high conservation value and need to be protected. The land here, almost 400 acres, lies above Scunthorpe steel works ore mines. A section of the Ironstone Way runs along the side of the land, skirting the numerous subsidences which are fenced off. The last thing this place needs is fly tipping and chemical contamination.

I am generally a positive person but sometimes we find things that are really upsetting or just too dire to handle; chemicals seeping into the soil, asbestos, and even animals trapped in thoughtlessly discarded litter. Over the 13 or 14 years we've been 'picking' there have been times I've thought, 'why bother.' That feeling doesn't last long purely because enough people DO bother and I think in our area we have many, many more people who care about our environment and who are prepared to do something about the mess left by the minority. Having said that, we all need a boost sometimes and finding a tenner thrown out with a box of McDonald's rubbish on Risby Road made my day a few weeks ago - we are £25 in credit this quarter! That and also the toots of horns, the



thumbs up and the thanks we get when people notice the work all volunteer pickers do really keep us motivated - and it's even better when someone says, 'I'll help!' and grabs a hoop, bag and litter stick and keeps their bit clean! You can chat with any regular North Lincs litter picker to find out how to proceed

# **Voter ID Required**



Voters in England will now need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in some elections, this requirement applies to .

- UK parliamentary elections, including general elections, by-elections and recall petitions
- Local elections and by-elections
- Police and Crime Commissioner elections

If you chose to vote by post you don't need photo ID nor do you need to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate if you choose to vote this way.

Here are some but not all acceptable forms of photo ID:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country (including an Irish Passport Card)
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (this includes a provisional driving licence)
- A Blue Badge
- Older Person's Bus Pass
- Disabled Person's Bus Pass

If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate.



# Solar Farms

# Roxby Solar Farm What's Planned?



A plan is to be submitted to apply to build a large solar park on land to the west of the A1077 running southward from Roxby landfill to top of Sawcliff Hill.

The land beneath the solar panels would remain in agricultural use for sheep grazing, or we could create a wildflower meadow to attract insects and birds and enhance biodiversity. It might also be possible to have beehives on site, for producing honey.

The solar farm would have a lifespan of 40 years. This is how long the planning permission would be granted for, and after this time the solar farm would be decommissioned. The solar panels would be recycled or sold on to be used elsewhere.

# Little Crow Solar Park

This build is to the west of Broughton on the cliff overlooking the steel works just touches into Appleby parish. The plans were submitted some time ago have now been approved.
